

Pardey Patterns at the Spaulding Wooden Boat Center



Patterns numbered as follows:

1. Bobstay fitting
- 2a. Boomkin fitting incorporating backstay tang and anchor roller
- 2b. Tang for boomkin fitting
3. Cranse iron (bowsprit end fitting)
- 3a. Core box for cranse iron (bowsprit end fitting)
4. Whisker stay tang, starbd.
- 4a. Whisker stay tang, port
5. Boomkin stay tang (interchangeable)
6. Chainplate
7. Gammon Iron (stemhead fitting)
8. Chain roller (for bow)
9. Upper gudgeon (fits flush on the transom). See Larry Pardey's *Details of Classic Boat Construction* for fitting details of gudgeons and pintles.
- 9a. Lower gudgeon
- 9b. Rudder pintle and pin (needs 25a to complete the rudder pintle pattern)
- 9c. Middle gudgeon
12. Jiffy reefing pennant fitting
13. Boom bail
14. Eye nut
15. Spinnaker pole fitting for instant spinnaker pole
- 15a. Spreader fittings, port and starboard
16. Mast boot band
17. Sheet winch mount. Cast two for post and starboard end of mount.

18. Lifeline stanchion base and core box
19. Hawse hole
- 20a. Boom gallows top (needs core box)
- 20b. Boom gallows core box (fits both top and base pattern)
22. Windvane gudgeon – at waterline
23. Dinghy chock base
24. Sculling oar lock
- 25a. Pin for pintle pater (9b)
- 25b. Cockpit Hatch hinge
26. Prism light frame — Simpson Lawrence standard prism glass
29. Oil lamp bracket for use on standard 1-1/2" diameter I.D brass waterpipe for table stanchions
30. Portlights, four pieces — Outer flange, inner flange, spigot, opening port
31. Windvane gudgeons, bottom, middle, top
32. Windvane tiller arm
33. Windvane gudgeon for bottom of rudder
34. Pin for pintle fitting

Note

Two more patterns will be added to this list in the future: the production boards for making the 1/4" and 3/8" clench rings used throughout Taleisin's construction.
